During 2017-18, the invasion of the fall armyworm (FAW) in Botswana posed a serious threat to food and nutrition security for vulnerable farming communities and households. Surveillance of pests, known as pest monitoring, will help to mitigate the negative impacts of FAW in the country and will also promote the wider use of pest management strategies. The project will work towards strengthening the capacity of AMEVs, systems that are available to all smallholder farmers. CABI has a team of experts and staff of the project on hand to provide technical assistance and training to AMEVs. The project is available including the conducting of pest monitoring and the provision of pest management strategies. The project is funded by the United Nations (FAO) and the Government of Botswana.
